CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2022

FOUNDATION It was a year to rebuild at Sundale Community Foundation (SCF).

As I look back over the last 12 months, I acknowledge and celebrate the work of our Board of Volunteers, who worked together in 2022 to again

build a return on our \$1M financial investment, promote the annual grants round, invite another community grants partner and ultimately help 12 local community organisations to receive grants.

This year (2021/22) SCF received 28 grant applications from local community organisations with a total of \$207,578.58 in total grants requested.

It's always an honour to host the Annual Grants ceremony in the heart of Nambour, at the RSL and invite Sunshine Coast Mayor Mark Jamieson to preside over the awards.

Ken Mills Toyota continued as a community partner contributing a \$5000 grant to the Nambour Tramway for AV equipment.

Sundale Limited Board generously donated \$15000 for grants to Parkinson's Restoring Hope \$6793 (LOUD therapy programs), Suncoast Christian Care \$5000 (towards mobile food van), and Compass Café - \$4545.45 (Exterior Café Mural).

Corporate Governance

I would like to again acknowledge the special contribution of Alan Clark as Public officer, Company Secretary and Treasurer in ensuring that the Foundation has met all compliance obligations concerned with ACNC, ASIC, the Australian Taxation Office and our Auditors.

With Alan retiring his position on the Board, this year we welcome Lawyer and Board volunteer observer, Alexander Upton. Alexander is a partner in Butler McDermott Nambour, and on 22 November will take a permanent role as Board Director and role of Public officer, Company Secretary and Treasurer.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank our auditor Simon Green for agreeing to complete the audit of the two trusts at a discounted rate. Once the audit is completed and the report received, Alexander Upton (as the new Company Secretary) will lodge the relevant returns with ASIC, ACNC and the Office of Fair Trading (QLD). We have all appropriate insurances in place to cover the company and its Officers.

The Board also acknowledges the generosity of 92.7 Mix FM for making available to the Foundation a very pleasant and comfortable meeting venue at their premises in Maroochydore. And for the community advertising donated to the foundation in May this year to promote the grants round.

Strategic Plan

The Board continue to implement the Sundale Community Foundation Strategic Plan 2021-24.



The three goals of the Foundation are:

- 1. To establish effective management and administration for Sundale Community Foundation
- 2. To administer grants to meet identified community needs
- 3. To establish community links to further the goals of Sundale Community Foundation.

SCF also completes a quarterly Operational Plan, tabled at Board Meetings.

Investment Policy – Trust Funds Investment

All funds gifted or raised for the Foundation are invested, with the majority of income earned from these investments, allocated to the community grants program each year and distributed to local groups and charities. Some of the income earned is retained and re-invested, with the aim of increasing the invested corpus over time. Administration expenses are sourced from benefactors or sponsors who are willing to support the ongoing work of the Foundation. Money donated to the Foundation for this purpose at commencement of the Foundation was utilised carefully and through generous donations from a regular donor enabled the Administration Fund to pay for its administrative needs in the past. At the commencement of the 2022 calendar year, Sundale Limited generously donated \$2000 to the Administration Fund to enable the SCF to pay the Director's Indemnity Insurance and its ASIC and ACNC fees. We thank the Board of Sundale Limited (our members) for their assistance. However, with increased costs in insurances, government fees and the costs for administering and updating our website, we still need to source further donations from local businesses to assist with meeting these operational costs.

Generous donations of \$10000 and \$5000 were made to the Public Ancillary Fund in June of 2022. The bulk of these funds will now be invested through Morgans CIMB in consultation with the investment committee of SCF, when it is thought to be an optimal time to invest.

Morgans CIMB (Noosa) were engaged in 2016 to administer our investment funds and in consultation with the Investment Committee of the Board all funds have been invested with the view to maximizing returns. The investment committee meets with the Morgan's Investment consultant in a formal capacity twice a year to discuss investment strategies and rebalance portfolios to ensure maximum returns. The agreement with Morgans was renewed for a further two years in March of 2022.

Every year we learn a little more about engagement with community organisations as well as our grant guidelines, application and selection process.

Like 2021, this year, we held our annual grants ceremony in October, this allows us to distribute funds to the community groups the day of the event. This allows more time in the new year for community groups to

acquit and our Communications to develop social media and media events to unveil the projects in the community.

Communicating with the Community

2021/22 has again been a successful year engaging through media, with SCF featured across many local media outlets, and our narrative building and social media following growing.

The media is changing on the Sunshine Coast with only one local TV station now based locally.

We develop a lot of our own media, generated by the grants ceremony, and attending community events with grant recipients throughout the year.

Mix FM 92.7 this year donated radio ads that ran 4 weeks prior to the annual grants round 1 June-31 July. We thank them for this support. Many of the applicants in the 2022 round were from hearing this advertising.

The local Sunshine Valley Gazette, also continue to support us by attending many media events, and generating ongoing print and social media stories.

Our communications lead Angela Baldwin reports:

Our continued media partnership with the Sunshine Valley Gazette in 2021 saw five community grant recipients profiled in the media (Palmwoods Warriors Football Club, Compass Institute, Nambour Wildcats, Nambour Tramway, Parkinson's Restoring Hope).
